

**Biographical Sketch
Paul Jay Fink, M.D.**

Paul Jay Fink, M.D., a prominent psychiatrist, psychoanalyst, and speaker, is currently Associate Vice President of the Albert Einstein Healthcare Network having recently been promoted after serving 10 years as Chairman, Department of Psychiatry, Albert Einstein Medical Center and Medical Director of the Belmont Center for Comprehensive Treatment. He is the founder and director of the Einstein Center for the Study of Violence. He is a Professor in the Department of Psychiatry, Temple University School of Medicine. He was Professor and Director of Education in the Department of Psychiatry of Hahnemann University (1964-1972), and Professor and Chairman of the Department of Psychiatry both at Eastern Virginia Medical School (1972-1976) and Thomas Jefferson University (1976-1984). A graduate of Temple University School of Medicine, Dr. Fink did his residency at the Philadelphia Psychiatric Center and his postgraduate training at the Institute of the Philadelphia Association of Psychoanalysis. Dr. Fink has extensive managerial, administrative, educational, planning, and clinical experience and is an expert in program development and enhancement.

He is a Past President of the American Psychiatric Association (APA), serves as a member of its Board of Trustees, currently chairs the Council on Economic Affairs, and is a member of the Committee on Managed Care. He has been honored by the APA by being awarded the Vestermark Award in 1982, the Francis J. Braceland Award for Public Service in 1990, and was part of the Distinguished Psychiatrist Lecture Series at the Annual Meeting of the APA in 1994. He has been the recipient of a number of national and local honors including the Bowis Award of the American College of Psychiatrists in 1988, the Georgia Department of Mental Health Festival of Hope Award in 1989, Camelback Hospitals' 1990 Humanitarian Award, and Pennsylvania Public Health Association Award for Service in Public Health in 1991.

He is President (1994-95) of the American College of Psychiatrists, a member of the American Medical Association's Residency Review Committee for Psychiatry, and Secretary (1994-95) of the National Association for Psychiatric Healthcare Systems. He is a Past President of the Philadelphia County Medical Society and Chairman of that organization's Third Party Payor Committee. He is Editor-in-Chief of the International Journal of Short-term Psychotherapy, and on the Editorial Advisory Boards of Clinical Psychiatry News and Physician News Digest. He is a founder and past president of the Greater Philadelphia Health Care Congress and in April of 1992 he was appointed by the Mayor to the Philadelphia Board of Health. He is a Board member of Philadelphia Health Management Corporation and the Opera Company of Philadelphia.

Dr. Fink has had over 140 articles published, has delivered over 700 lectures across the country as well as internationally on topics including human sexuality, creative arts therapy, psychoanalysis, psychiatric education, economic problems facing modern psychiatry, the relationship between psychiatry and primary care, the stigma against the mentally ill and their caretakers, and violence. He is co-editor of the book, "The Stigma of Mental Illness." He has been a spokesman for psychiatry as an invited guest on national and local television shows and radio programs, and has been quoted in a variety of publications.

Dr. Fink is married to Phyllis Fink, a teacher, and is the father of three grown sons, one of whom is a practicing psychiatrist in Philadelphia.
