Things are busy but going well for me here. I've decided to defer my acceptance into school until next fall and the advertising department has guaranteed that they will accept me. Hopefully, this year will give me time to follow up on some leads I've gotten into the non-academic but media interested community in Austin. I'm finally beginning to make some inroads into the Austin non-academic community. I've been asked to be on the planning committee for a media literacy conference which will occur next spring, I know nothing about the group or the target audience yet, but will attend the first planning meeting next week. I'm finding that it's easier working through the religious community than the academic community. I am still looking for connections to the Austin media, but perhaps that will come if Council for Public Media can ever complete it's chart of who owns the media in Austin.

It's past time to update the CEM web page and make it more functional for the organization. In addition to the document we already have on the web, I'd like to put the Viewer's Declaration up, the Organizational Structure, the Action Agenda, and I thought I would link to Cees' version of the People's Charter, if it is the most current version. Does this sound alright to you?

I also thought that it would be nice to have 'a letter from the founder,' page if you think it's appropriate. I thought it could be very similar to the letter that will go out with the next mailing, but with a line or two about using the internet, or something like that. Either that page or another page devoted strictly to news on CEM could be more or less a bulletin board for interesting news and developments on CEM. Perhaps as various activities begin to take place, like the possible case for connecting public interest and licensing, or Joan Seckler's alternative convention coverage, I can develop a news page to post recent occurrences.

At the last board meeting, several people mentioned using the web page for networking. I am not sure what they have in mind other than a list of the

affiliated and supporting organizations linked to their homepages when available. I am working on producing such a list, and will probably solicit URL's from the members of CEMnet today or tomorrow. At this moment, the members of CEMnet can get e-mail addresses for everyone on CEMnet if they send the recipient command to the listprocessor, so I don't see the need to produce any kind of e-mail directory for CEM other than the office for people to contact for information on joining.

It sounds fantastic. I wish I could be there. That Saturday is one of my dates to coordinate the broadcast for a class we're doing on Western Hemispheric Economic Integration with Monterrey Tech in Monterrey, Mexico. The signal for this class will originate in Austin at a new teleconference/broadcast facility and will be sent via Monterrey's satellite to 22 cities in Mexico and Texas. The facility is new and not fully tested. I and a technician will be responsible for the technical end of things including a computer relay system for feed back from the other campuses. It's important to my job that I be there.

Please let me know if there is any thing you would like me to report on, or make comments on. Also, if it begins to look as though you will not have a quorum and really need my presence, please let me know and I'll see what I can work out. My sister lives in Burlingame the actual site of the San Francisco airport. I love it there.

Liz Thoman has agreed to come to Austin next February 22nd for a media literacy conference. The planning committee is hoping that this will be a kick off for a media awareness/literacy movement in Austin. I'm using this opportunity to network with people and have already handed out the CEM conference documents to the members of the planning committee. We have people from the Texas State curriculum development agency, the Univ. of Texas (Ellen Wartella's folks), two other local colleges, one major broadcast station, the local PBS affiliate, the Catholic Diocese, and me. I really hope that something comes of it. I'm networking like crazy.

I was a panel member on Austin Faith Dialogue recently, a show produced by the local FOX affiliate. The topic was media literacy, and John Wright of the Center for Research into the Influence of Television on Children (CRITC) was a panel member. He and Aletha Huston have come to UT this year.

Please keep me posted about the retreat. Let me know if there's something I can do to help.

Well you were right, you had been deleted from the list. The listprocessor has a strange, cryptic system for occasionally deleting addresses when messages bounce back. It doesn't always do this, which is why I get so many error messages every time I send a message to the list. Some people's addresses bounce messages again and again and they don't get deleted. Occasionally a machine will be down, or because there is so much traffic it won't accept e-mail at that time, or perhaps an individual's mailbox is full so the message bounces. I get error messages that a message can't get through. Often my error message says that the listprocessor will attempt to send the message to that person again later. I've gotten error messages from asc.upenn.edu before, but apparently at least once, the message was of the type that causes the listprocessor to delete an address from the cemnet file.

This is very troubling to me, I must find out how to avoid it in the future. In addition to adding the new people to cemnet I will find an old list of addresses and try and see if there are any other people, like yourself, who are missing. The problem is that some people have legitimately signed off and I will have to go through my archives to ascertain who should be deleted and who got bumped by the system.

I received the list of new addresses, I will add them as soon as I go through and remove the ones who are already subscribed.

Are you going to be doing some kind of chat thing for UTNE this month on their web cafe? Would you like me to announce the article on CEMnet?

Also, I think I will go ahead and post the Asimovar report and Press Release on the web page. I can then announce to the list that they are there and anyone who hasn't seen the report can get it from the web site. I'll wait until the new people are added to do this so they can get the report.
