Prof. Gerbner:

Just a note to follow up on my telephone call today. The references I was looking for are cited on p. 26 of report #102: Elliot and Slater, 1980; Reeves, 1978, and Greenberg, 1982. I am working on the enclosed paper which was presented at the ISRA meetings last summer.

I also have some very extensive data on all news and public affairs programming over a 6 month period for WWOR-TV, some of which examines violence. These data were part of an extensive FCC case involving a challenge to MCA for the license Channel 9 in New Jersey. Unfortunately, the case was recently settled out of court so the testimony about how WWOR failed to serve the public will never appear. I hope to eventually present this in some form to other researchers. In the mean time, I will send you some old studies on Philadelphia news.
