Thank you so much for agreeing to come to Wilmington on Thursday, May 16th, to speak. Your lecture is scheduled to take place at 7 PM in the auditorium of Wilmington Friends School, 101 School Road, Alapocas, Wilmington, DE 19803. I deeply appreciate your acceptance of our invitation and I very much enjoyed speaking with you over the telephone.

The one thing that I neglected to ask you during our conversation was what you would like to entitle your speech. Would you like to call it, "Television Violence: The Power and the Peril" or would you prefer something else? Please call me at 302-656-2721 with the title, or fax it to me at 302-656-2730 as soon as it is convenient. I would like to begin publicizing the event by the end of February.

To reiterate our conversation, Pacem in Terris will cover your transportation expenses to and from Wilmington and will provide you with a modest honorarium of \$75. (I wish that we could offer you more, but as a peace with justice group we are forced to live on a fairly narrow shoestring.) Wilmington is on the SEPTA line, the R-2. I will pick you up at the Wilmington train station and will see that you return to the station for your return train.

The Peace Studies Department at Wilmington Friends has agreed to co-sponsor the event, so we can anticipate about 60 students in addition to our members, and the general public. The evening should end by 9 PM. Please speak for 45 minutes and allow time for questions from the floor for another 35 to 40 minutes.

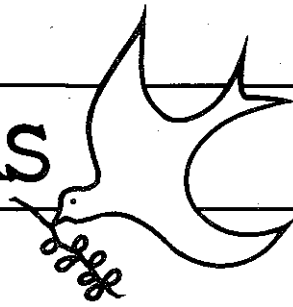
Thank you again, and I greatly look forward to hearing you. If I have forgotten anything, please do not hesitate to call me.

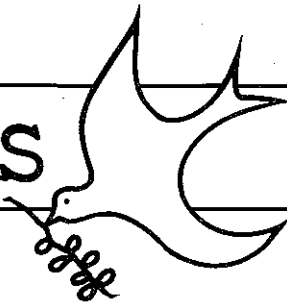
