Dear Dr. Gerbner:

Confirming our telephone conversations, the New York City Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists, the Deadline Club, plans to bestow its First Amendment Award on March 1, 2000 to Bill Moyers of PBS for his investigative report, "Free Speech For Sale."

The event will take place at 7 P.M. at the National Arts Club, 15 Gramercy Park South, New York City. Following the award presentation, a panel discussion will follow in which you have agreed to participate.

As you know, "Free Speech For Sale" sounded the alarm where corporate media ownership has influenced news content or thwarted and/or suppressed stories contrary to their business interests, particularly regarding their financial profits from the 1996 Telecommunications Act. The traditional "wall" between the editorial side and the business side of journalism is under attack as evidenced by serious ethical lapses at Disney/ABC, CBS 60 Minutes and most recently at the Los Angeles Times to name a few instances. The panel discussion will focus on threats to the First Amendment and the loss of journalistic integrity when corporate profits and share holder value overrides the public's right to know.

Having heard your recent presentation at Salt Lake City, I know your research and efforts on behalf of the First Amendment will bring many facts to light, based on your experience as a working journalist and academician. We look forward to your involvement on this issue.

I have contacted our national office in Indiana to obtain more information about applying for grant funding from the SPJ Sigma Delta Chi Foundation which is given semi-annually.
