**IAMCR INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL  
MEETING MINUTES, 27 JUNE 1995  
PORTOROZ, SLOVENIA**

**Opening**

President Hamid Mowlana opened the meeting in the presence of the following members:

Executive Board: H. Mowlana (President), S. Splichal (Deputy Secretary General), G. Robinson (Treasurer), F-X. Hutin, O. Linne, A. Mear (Vice-Presidents).

International Council: U. Carlsson, F. Corcoran, B. Dervin, W. Donsbach, G. Gerbner, C. Gomez Mont, C. Hamelink, Y. Ito, C. Kim, K. Lundby, O. Manaev, D. McQuail, M. Pares i Maicas, A. Malek, M. Mander, Y. Mignot-Lefebvre, K. Nordenstreng, D. Paletz, M. Pendakur, F. Perrone, O. Prehn, R. Samarajiva, J. Servaes, T. Syvertsen, B. Tufte, J. Wasko, Carlos Arnaldo (UNESCO).

Apologies were received from the following members:

A. Abd el Rahman, A. Brown, N. de Camargo, A. Fadul, O. Gandy, J. D. Halloran, J. Jouet, W. Kleinwaechter, J. Marques de Melo, L. Rao, L. U. Uche, L. Van Zoonen.

The President announced the resignation of Secretary General Robin Cheesman. Copies of Mr. Cheesman's letter of resignation were distributed to all members of the International Council. Past President Hamelink read a statement regarding Cheesman's resignation and thanked him for his services. A motion was passed to express gratitude for Cheesman's services.

**1. Minutes**

The minutes of the International Council meetings of July 3-4, 1994, in Seoul, Korea, were approved with a number of corrections.

**2. Report from the President**

The President reported on the activities of the Association since the Seoul Conference and summarized his written report, copies of which were distributed to the International Council in advance. He reported that the process of decentralization has been effective, and that the association is in a sound financial position now. His reports included the external relations of IAMCR as well as the implementations of all the policy decisions taken by the General Assembly

in Seoul, Korea. President Mowlana congratulated Deputy Secretary General Slavko Splichal for the organization and success of the Portoroz Conference and thanked the conference staff for the program arrangements and all of their assistance.

Hamelink discussed the financial state of the association and indicated that the expenses involving rental of the Amsterdam office for the period of September 1994 to October 1995 and related items had been included in his budget submitted to the General Assembly in Seoul, Korea. President Mowlana agreed that references to this matter be deleted, as these expense items will be recorded as part of the current budget report.

### **3. Report from the Treasurer**

Treasurer Gertrude Robinson presented expenses and income of the Association since the Seoul Conference and noted the contributions made by various officers and their institutions in support of the Association's expenses. She reported that the Association has been able to operate within the US \$50,000 budget approved by the General Assembly, and considering the expected expenses for the remainder of the year, the overall financial condition of the Association will remain within the allotted budget. Efforts will be made to reinstate the use of credit cards for payment.

### **4. Reports from the Vice-Presidents**

Olga Linne stated that she had recruited the School of Journalism in the Ukraine for IAMCR membership. Francois-Xavier Hutin reported collaborative work with members of the newsletter editorial staff, and he also noted that IAMCR flyers have been published in French. Annie Mear reported on the activities regarding the Association's fundraising.

### **5. 1996 Conference and Future Conferences**

President Mowlana reported on the progress of the 1996 Conference Committee for the Twentieth General Assembly and Scientific Conference in Sydney. The proposal by the University of Strathclyde to hold IAMCR's Twenty-first General Assembly and Scientific Conference in Glasgow, Scotland in 1998 was unanimously approved.

### **6. Admission of New Members**

The Council approved the list of candidates for individual and institutional memberships.

## **7. Report from International Council Standing Committees**

The Publications Committee reported that the book series has commenced- one book has been released, and another is in press. It was reported that Robin Cheesman and Janet Wasko, newsletter editors, are stepping down from their positions. The International Council approved a motion to thank them for their services. There were no reports submitted by other Standing Committees.

## **8. Reports from Section Presidents**

The Professional Education Committee reported that a contract has been completed with the Council of Europe in order to carry out a study on journalistic ethics in Europe. The committee also announced the creation of a depository library project, with the purpose of building a network of publication libraries in the developing countries. The Communication Technology Policy Section reported on the establishment of the Electronic Communication Technical Project (ECTP) for use as a means to increase communication between members and others in the field.

The Participatory Communication Research Section stated that reports from the UNESCO-IAMCR Roundtable on Development and Communication are available to members. The Local Radio and TV Section reported on its involvement in the development of media in the Baltic states. The Law Committee reported that, since the Seoul Conference, it has focussed its efforts on the legal implications of the Global Information Infrastructure (GII), the legal aspects of the right to communicate, and the new legal framework for the media in Central and Eastern Europe.

The International Communication Section reported that it will hold a joint conference with the International Communication Association's Intercultural and Development Section in Chicago. The History Section announced that a manuscript of the Seoul Conference papers on propaganda would be available soon, and the directory list has been mailed. The Sociology and Social Psychology Section reported on the sessions it had organized for the conference. The Documentation and Information Systems Section presented the final report, emphasizing the need for increased coordination between its section and others.

## **9. Technical Election Committee**

In accordance with the procedure for postal voting for the Executive Board, a Technical Elections Committee composed of Youichi Ito, Janet Wasko, and Rohan Samarajiva was elected.

## **10. Report from UNESCO**

Mr. Carlos Arnaldo, representative of UNESCO, presented a report on UNESCO's activities. He proposed that communication and development be given more prominence as a topic of discussion. IAMCR may wish to give more attention to this issue by upgrading a roundtable at the Sydney Conference.

## **11. Human Rights Committee**

A proposal to establish an IAMCR committee on human rights was discussed. The council unanimously approved this proposal, and the following members were elected as members of Human Rights Committee: Shalini Venturelli (chair), Chie-Woon Kim, Olga Linne, Yvonne Mignot-Lefebvre, and Fernando Perrone.

## **12. A.O.B.**

George Gerbner announced the formation of the Cultural Environment Movement, which will hold its founding convention in St. Louis on March 15-17, 1996. The motion that IAMCR co-sponsor the convention as a symbolic gesture was passed unanimously.

It was proposed that George Gerbner, Valerie Pisarek and Herbert Schiller be recognized and honored at the Sydney Conference. The proposal was unanimously approved.
