Plans have two key events...Dinner with Gerbner, et al on Thursday evening (we are likely to be tired and not at our best)

Only time to get YOU and McChesney in Room and invite others to meet is LUNCH TIME on SATURDAY....

I can prepare flier...saying meet CEM et al...and leave blank until there and add text at KINKO's.

George has asked that I work with you to represent the "staff" in coordinating the developing of our strategic planning effort for CEM.

It seems there was a Board committee with a similar charge two years ago with Mark Crispin Miller. No record is available at this time of its work product.

I see this committee as AD HOC Cte. reporting to Board with latest information and analysis based on conditions at the end of 1999. I will quiry Elaine and others on Board to provide any previous reports. Certainly like all plans this one requires timely update.

There was an important meeting in San Francisco today with CEM Board member Mark Lloyd...He and Linda Billings also on CEM Board are spear heading new coalition called PEOPLE FOR BETTER TV. The focus of the effort is to call upon the FCC to hold public hearings to determine the public interest standards for licensing the new DIGITAL TV STATIONS. It seems that FCC Chair Wm Kennard will be in San Francisco for the upcoming TELEPHONE ASSOCIATION (USTA) convention on Oct. 18-20 and we believe that a meeting can be arranged with Kennard and public interest advocates.

A field staff person from that campaign (PEOPLE for BetterTV) is based in Los Angeles and will attend the San Diego Conf.

I have 6 pages of background info which I can FAX. And can have copies with me in EUGENE.

I think we should add this effort...along with developing a strategic plan for next steps...one perceptive attendee asked Lloyd to address the overall strategy and further steps he has in mind for DEMOCRATIC communication system. Clearly he does either have that in mind or possibly does not wish to deter or derail his immediate coalition focus. THIS MIGHT BE THE TASK FOR CEM.

Legal Challenge to the TELECOMM ACT. Rev. Sawyer has a 12 page "Brandeis Brief" for lawyers to review and comment concerning the framework for such a challenge. Again this is element to the OVERALL STRATEGY our movement needs.

CITIZENS for INDIE PUBLIC TV...Jerry Starr has funding ready

to begin...but not yet off and running. I have asked him for any materials for us to distribute at San Diego and Eugene.

TV Boycott proposals...NAACP -

Hispanic Congressional Caucus and Jesse Jackson and National Council of Churches call on FCC for hearings on VIACOM CBS merger.

Steve Allen group...another initiative being endorsed for better less violent TV by famous entertainer.

Right wing attempt to use the public outcry against BAD and Violent TV for more control and censorship.

Congressional resolutions and legislative initiatives for limitations on the Telecom Act...prohibition of sale and transfer of public TV and Radio stations in US...even if not successful we can have "friendly" Congress person work on these issues ... keeping something alive. Labor Group....UPPNET is working on three such resolutions to bring to next weeks AFL CIO convention in Los Angeles.

These are some considerations for our upcoming discussions...

Hi Henry,

Sorry for the delayed response; I have been in a metaphorical dungeon for 2 weeks doing a research grant application and am only just coming up for air. (Bob: I took your name in vain as a possible referee, hope that's okay.) The application is for 3 years of support to continue analysis of "Democratic media reform as a social movement."

Thanks for your summary memo, Henry: I think we can confirm dinner at 7.30, on Thursday Oct 14 -- I have asked Janet Wasko to suggest a nearby restaurant, but we can touch base at the Reception.

Also, let's confirm a lunch meeting on Saturday at 12, though there won't be much time between sessions for that.

I don't think your memo mentioned the Friday Oct. 15 huddle at 4 p.m. before the UDC business meeting -- is that still on? I asked Janet to check into a room for that too.

As for the strategy/options ad hoc committee, thanks for your messages of support on that; if I understand correctly, Henry & I should work on that *after* we have ascertained what Mark Crispin Miller's committee came up with a couple of years ago. Also, I plan thoroughly to re-read the Founding Documents and the Liberating Alternatives book before the UDC conference, to get as clear a sense as possible of CEM's core mandate(s). George, I think, recently defined it as promoting diversity -- would we have a consensus on that? This is not an 'academic' question, as any campaign CEM chooses to back with its limited resources would need to have broad support, as well as be integrally related to its core mandate. It should also, I suggest, be amenable to action at both local and national levels, should draw upon and help to build progressive networks and coalitions, and should potentially yield small successes -- not necessarily an all-or-nothing proposition. I'd like to review the suggestions in Henry's memo in light of those criteria.
