Greetings from SLOOC President



I would like to welcome all of you who have come from the east and west, north and south to participate in the World Academic Conference of the Seoul Olympiad '88.


Although it is being sponsored on the occasion of the Olympic Games, our academic conference is more than a celebratory activity of the olympics and holds significance as an historical event.

Sub-theme I Chairman's Program Overview

Changing Families in the World Perspective

Through the ages, the family has been the unchanging basic unit of society. During the agriculturally-based economic period, the family included extended family members. But, since the advent of the Post-Industrial Society, the basic family unit has been reduced to include only those members of the nuclear family. Questions that must be inevitably raised due to the rapid changes that have taken place in the Post-Industrial period are what will happen to the family structure and how will the changes that are taking place affect society in the future?

Each society develops in a unique manner, although some changes that take place in the industrial and Post-Industrial period are universal within all societies. In particular, we must note that each society cannot develop its economy in isolation from its religion, history, and culture, all of which combine to launch the society in a certain direction.

The problems and the changes wrought in the family structure due to industrialization cannot be easily solved on the individual family level. Combining the areas of the humanities and social sciences, this conference will analyze aspects in religion, history and culture on the themes of "Economic Development and the Family," "Gender Equality and Social Change," and "Family Policy" for the dual purpose of judging the effectiveness of past policies and to forecast the direction in which the family is headed.

Sub-theme II Chairman's Program Overview

Continuity and Change in Communications in Post-Industrial Society

Post-Industrial Society has become an "Information Society" due to the swift development of communication technology. The extremely rapid changes that are taking place have had an unprecedented influence on the political, economic, cultural and social aspects of society for which we cannot give any explanation based on paradigms of the past.

The expansion of communication technology is such that each country is no longer isolated, but organically related to one another and therefore vulnerable to external influences. In fact, the speed at which communication technology is developing inherently poses the question of how effectively mankind will be able to adjust to the changes in society. The encroachment on the individual's privacy and the over-abundance of information have led to an extreme which has become difficult to accommodate. Thus, we are pressed with the urgent responsibility of solving the unbalanced development of East and West, North and South.

A fundamental reassessment of our Information Society must take place to determine whether mass media should be evaluated by our present criteria, or in a newly formulated frame. Through the subthemes of "World Communication Philosophy," "New Communication Technology and Society," "Communication Issues in the Third World," and "The Role of Mass Media in the World Community," this conference will analyze the status quo of contemporary communications for a future outlook into our Post-Industrial society.

Sub-theme IV Chairman's Program Overview

Encounter Between the East and West and the Creation of a Global Culture

Until the cultural encounter between the East and West became active and widespread, mainly as a result of industrialization, the two cultural domains had existed virtually in isolation from one another. Only occasional conquests and the painstaking efforts of travelling merchants had barely maintained the interaction between them.

With its basic ingredients of capitalist industrialization, however, modernization by nature has entailed a process of international acculturation tilted against the non-Western world. The West has been actively imposing its own culture upon the East which had enjoyed original and high civilizations in its time, but has since been relegated to a status of passive recipient in the culture of modernization.

As the present century approaches its end, there appear signs of possible reversal in this unilateral acculturation. Some non-Western societies have more than caught up with the West in terms of industrial and technological development. The West, conversely, has been going through a period of serious reflections on the viability in the technological civilization it has cultivated. It is in this context that attempts are being made to re-examine the cultural resources of the East in a new light.

With the growing recognition that cultural plurality among nations is to be respected, a deeper and better understanding of one another's culture is essential for the creation of a global civilization to be confronted in the coming century as a result of dialectical lutheben between the two cultures.

In order to examine the characteristics and significance of the East-West cultural encounter in the light of creating a global culture, this international conference will focus its attention on three central questions:

- 1) How do cultures view other cultures?
- 2) How do cultures of the East and West meet the challenge of acculturation in global industrialization? and
- 3) How do the arts of the East and West influence each other?

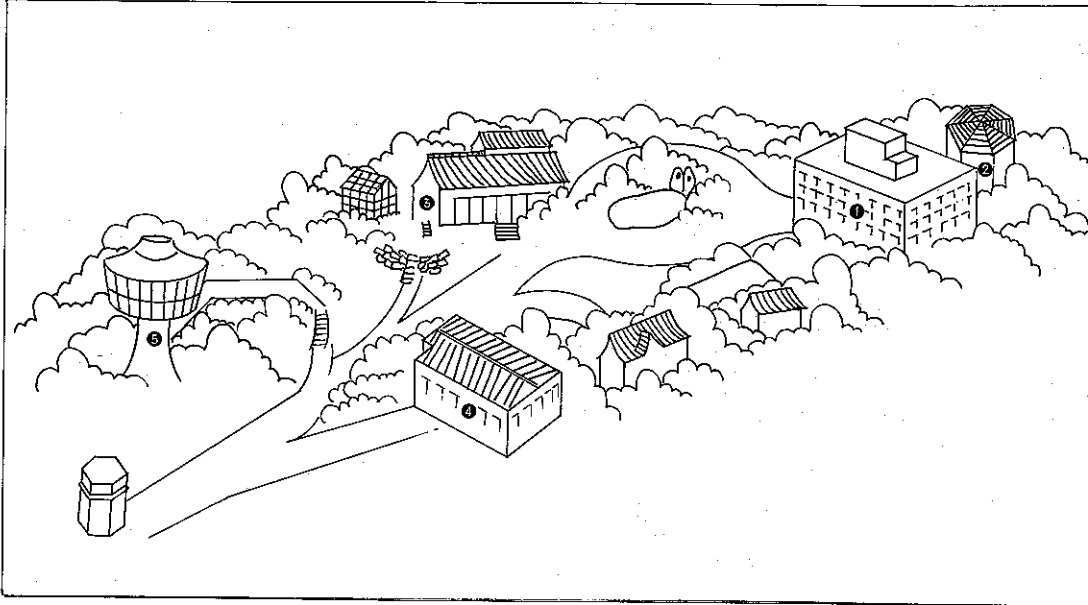
