INTERNATIONAL AND NON-U.S. COVERAGE IN RECENT ISSUES  
OF THE JOURNAL OF COMMUNICATION

The Journal of Communication has actively sought articles and authors from around the world. Recently, we have increased the number of Consulting and Contributing Editors from outside the United States and non-U.S. "CCEs" number 41, for 32 percent of the total. As will be seen below, we also include numerous books published outside the U.S. in our book review section and make a special effort to include reviews of communications books published in other languages. As also seen below, Intercom is a particularly active forum for international news.

Of the approximately 250 articles submitted each year to the Journal for possible publication, about 25 to 30 are submitted by non-U.S. scholars, the bulk of which come from Scandinavia, Canada, Nigeria, and Israel, with a few from Great Britain, Latin America, and Asia. For symposia, such as "Ferment in the Field" and "The U.S. Decision to Withdraw from UNESCO," we often solicit the work of non-U.S. scholars. We have also emphasized communications research from around the world in such articles and symposia as those on SITE, "European Broadcasting in Transition," "The Politics of Language," and "Communication in the Far North."

Overall, about one-third of each section of the Journal contains material that is explicitly international in topic or authorship. This amounts to at least 80 pages per issue. Of course, the remainder of the Journal represents what we strive to make the best research available on communications topics that would be relevant to all those interested in communications theory, research, and policy.
