
Dear George,

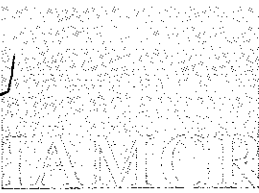

Dear George,

It was good to hear from you and I enjoyed reading all the CEM related materials. I am very glad to see the project moving into an international movement that can make a difference!

I am certainly interested in contributing to the planned founding conference if timing and funding problems can be resolved.

The People's Communication Charter project is still on and the situation is as follows.

1. We (i.e. the Centre for Communication & Human Rights) have received a number of useful suggestions for improvement of the text; I also have received documents from various related initiatives. This makes it possible to produce a next version which should be the basis for the next step in the process: the bringing about of a strategic alliance of those who support the intent of the charter and its broader goal to strive towards an internationale recognition of the people's right to communicate by the time of the 50th anniversary of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights in 1998.

2. We have started an exchange with related initiatives to see how these can be linked with the Charter en route to 1998.

3. Before the end of this year the Third World Network plans a strategy meeting in Geneva to discuss how the communications/cultural issue can be brought on the Social Summit agenda (Copenhagen 1995) and into further GATT/WTO negotiations and decision making.

4. We are exploring with Inter Press Service, Society for International Development a.o. whether the UN Social Summit in Copenhagen March 1995 offers an opportunity to discuss the PCC with the NGO community.

5. In any case there is a need for some sort of international gathering in 1995 to discuss the Charter and act upon it by planning the ratification procedure/ implementation/ publicity etc.

6. In 1996 there should be a major event celebrating the PCC adoption and planning for 1998.

We are planning a modest fund raising campaign to cover some of the basic costs in moving the project beyond its present stage.

The March conference would provide an excellent opportunity to plan the further logistics that ensure a mutual strengthening of CEM and PCC.


I am presently involved in the preparations for a new Independent Commission on Information, Communication and Social Development and will certainly feed the CEM objectives into the deliberations of the Commission. As soon as we have more concrete information on this project, I shall share it with you.

I am also working with the International Federation of Journalists on a world-wide effort in human rights education for journalists, editors and publishers. This provides a unique opportunity to bring some of the CEM ideas to the media workers in various countries. Again, something we might want to discuss at the March conference.

We should keep each other well informed about our endeavour and see where and when forces can be joined.

Dear George, as the St Louis convention begins to approach I have some logistical questions.

1. How is the ratification of the Charter foreseen? By what type of act/ceremony/vote?
2. What version of the charter will we use? The version I sent you will be on the Charter WWW site from next week on (I'll mail you the URL) shortly. This text is presently being revised as I received some very useful amendments (not anything fundamental, though) from several human rights groups.
3. How will the text be available to convention participants?

I am really sorry that at this point in time Unesco and IFJ are still too (unreasonably) hesitant to join the CEM process. We'll get them involved though even if it demands some more patience.

My tentative travel plans are to arrive in St. Louis March 14th and leave March 18th. Look forward to hearing from you and wish you every success with the last minute preparations, best regards, Cees.

Dear Cees - good to hear from you and pleased to convey this info.

1. I have also collected comments on Charter copy you sent me and will incorporate in proposed revised draft. It would be very important to get your update. Please e-mail and/or fax (610 642 3061 takes both voice and fax at home). We hope to act on latest version plus our own changes. If acceptable to you, this will be a joint Charter with CEM.

2. Our draft will be given to Convention participants in advance (or upon arrival), discussed in Working Groups, reported at plenary session Sunday, further discussed there, and approved with or without amendment. That action will constitute recommendation to both of our groups so we can reconcile if needed, etc.

3. We do not need formal affiliation at this point. However, it would be very useful we could list UNESCO and IFJ as "supporting organizations" along with some 35-40 others. I already have a supportive letter from Yushkiavitsus, but would like to confirm that ok to list. Could you make a call to them and let me know - we are going to press with a mailing and it would be great to know by tomorrow. (Sorry about the rush)

5. Let me have your exact arrival time and you'll be met at the airport in St. Louis. Will send info later about your role and place on the program.

HERE IS DRAFT RELEASE -- FYI

An International Broadcast Standards Summit, the first such meeting ever held, will open the Founding Convention of the Cultural Environment Movement (CEM) March 15-17, 1996, in St. Louis, MI.

The Summit will assemble heads of broadcast standards councils and communications commissions in the U.S., Canada, the United Kingdom, and other countries. Attending the Summit will be Keith Spicer, Chairman of the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission, Colin Shaw, Director of the Broadcasting Standards Council, United Kingdom [others to be confirmed].

The Summit participants will discuss national policy priorities and perspectives, and contribute to the drafting of a universal People's Communication Charter to be considered by the Convention. After the initial session on March 15, the participants will join a Working Group on global communication, one of 14 Working Groups of the Convention, and report their recommendations to the final plenary session on March 17.

The CEM Founding Convention will assemble on the campus of its host

and co-sponsor, Webster University. It will be the inaugural congress of the Cultural Environment Movement, a coalition of independent citizens' organizations and supporters in every state of the U.S. and 57 other countries on six continents. Delegates to the Convention represent a wide range of social and cultural concerns, united in working for freedom, fairness, diversity, responsibility, respect for cultural integrity, the protection of children, and democratic decision-making in the cultural mainstream of all countries.

In addition to Summit participants, the distinguished group of featured speakers includes The Rev. Dr. Joan Brown Campbell, General Secretary, National Council of Churches; Dorothy Gilliam, Washington Post columnist and Immediate Past President of the National Association of Black Journalists; Robert McChesney, historian and author of Telecommunications, Mass Media and Democracy; Sumi Sevilla Haru, Immediate Past President of the Screen Actors Guild; Riane Eisler, cultural historian, author of The Chalice and the Blade: Our History our Future; Lynn Curtis, President of the Eisenhower Foundation, Keyan Tomaselli, Director, Centre for Cultural and Media Studies, University of Natal, Durban, South Africa; Teresa Heinz, Chair, Heinz Family Philanthropies (invited), and Cees Hamelink [please supply relevant title and bio-sketch ASAP]



Dear George, thanks for the 'final' text. I propose that the key actors involved (CEM, CCHR, AMARC and TWN) now broadcast this to their constituencies asking them to support and further distribute this text and to recommend and develop ideas for implementation on local and national levels. I have now established a small task force in the N. of people who want to: upgrade and expand our site on the WWW; to establish a Dutch chapter of CEM; to seek grants for implementation of the charter in the Netherlands; to assist in expanding our networks internationally. Once that is all under control and under its own steam I turn my attention more to: 1. working with AMARC on a global event in 1997 to celebrate and endorse the CEM programme and Charter, etc. and to bring together, if possible, from a wide range of countries initiatives/movements that support the cause; and 2. the international political community and spend some more time on negotiations with the UN family on how they can support our endeavour. Anyway, no dearth of work for the years ahead. Keep in touch, best Cees.
