D. Personnel and Facilities

Principal Investigator: Donald A. Hansen (full-time June 15 - September 14, 1967; one-third time September 15, 1967 - June 14, 1968)

Hansen combines formal training in sociology, education, mass media and psychology with research and teaching experience in departments of Sociology and of Education. His undergraduate major in Psychology (Minnesota, 1955) was followed by a Master's Degree in Mass Communications (Minnesota, 1958), a Ph.D. in Education (Northwestern, 1962) and a Ph.D. in Sociology (Minnesota, 1962).

His teaching experience includes graduate appointments at Minnesota, a year as assistant director in the guidance laboratory at Northwestern, two years as lecturer in educational sociology at the University of Otago (New Zealand), and two years in the Department of Sociology, Purdue University. He currently holds an assistant professorship at the University of California, Santa Barbara, where he offers graduate and undergraduate courses in Sociology of Mass Communications and Sociology of Education.

His research experience includes collaboration on projects which sought to systematically integrate theories and findings on problem areas of family research, inquiry into the political functions of the mass communications, development of theories of motivation and language capabilities consistent with the study of institutionalization and change, and continuing work (originally supported by the Office of Education, see below) toward the development of a methodological theory for the study of education in which the general theories of psychology and sociology are developed in an integrated manner consistent with normative concerns.
