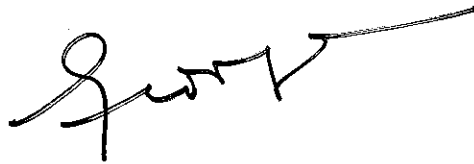

As Mrs. Clinton's principal advisor, Williams managed the First Lady's press and political relations, domestic and international policy and travel agendas and White House social and constituent outreach activities.

Margaret Williams is the former director of media affairs for the Children's Defense Fund and served as the director of media relations for the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities. Her political communications experience includes positions as deputy press secretary for the Democratic National Committee, press secretary to U. S. Representative Robert Torricelli and congressional aide to U. S. Representative Morris K. Udall.

Margaret Williams has served as a consultant to the Modern Language Association, Chevron Overseas Corporation, Hill and Knowlton-Paris and the Scholastic Publishing Corporation. Williams was a founding board member of the Communications Consortium in Washington, D.C., which provides media and public relations support to nonprofit organizations. Williams currently sits on the Food and Research Action Center (FRAC) board.
