I am pleased to write this report of my review of Dr. Hussein Amin's scholarly work and professional activities.

.Dr. Amin's study of broadcasting in the Middle East and North Africa is a combination of historical and empirical research. It is one of the few (if not only) reviews of its kind, introducing Middle East broadcasting to an international readership. Its scope and sweep matches the originality of effort.

The Encyclopedia article is equally authoritative and comprehensive. His contribution to *New Patterns in Global Television* and *The Journal of African Communications* exhibits the theoretical grasp and political sophistication expected of a mature scholar.
